Research

The NSGLC is conducting research on legal issues associated with aquatic invasive species in commerce as part of a [project](#) funded by the U.S. Department of Interior. In addition to participating in workgroup meetings on labeling, monitoring, enforcement, regulation, outreach, and industry standards, the NSGLC's conducting research into case studies of marbled crayfish, the red-eared slider, and water hyacinth sales. The case studies will highlight regulatory, resource, or enforcement gaps, as well as areas of success that can be modeled and replicated for other invasive species.

In March 2023, the State of Mississippi passed a law expanding private leasing of oyster reefs. [Read our one-pager](#) to learn more.

NSGLC Director gave a presentation on June 21 during the NAISMA monthly webinar series about the NSGLC's new project to create a model legal framework for noxious weed programs focused on pathway prevention through certified weed free forage, gravel, and mulch. During the course of the three-year project, the NSGLC will conduct an inventory and gap analysis of noxious weed statutes, regulations, and policies nationwide and develop a model framework to encourage harmonization of state noxious weed laws to advance NAISMA's Weed Free Program standards. The project is supported with funding through NAISMA from the U.S. Department of Commerce.
